## John Blow Primary School Accessibility Plan

## Aim

To improve access to the school for those with disabilities.

## <u>Definition of disability</u>

A disability is a mental of physical impairment which is long term, substantial, adverse and has an effect on the child's ability to carry out normal day to day activities. Physical or mental impairments can include sensory impairments (such as those affecting sight and hearing). The definition also covers certain medical conditions when they have a long term and substantial effect on pupils' everyday lives. (From the Disability Discrimination Act 1995)

## Current physical access and constraints

The school is housed in one building approximately 50 years old.

- There is a disabled toilet and shower room
- Ramps are provided to the main entrance and Elm class, although the main entrance is then accessed through a foyer
- All other external doors have a small raised step
- There are no steps within the building
- The building is surrounded by level paving
