

## John Blow Primary School

### Family survey results

## October 2023

Following parent consultation evenings, a survey was shared with all parents. The event was attended by 97% of parents/carers; plans are in place to contact the remaining parents. The survey was completed via a Microsoft Form by 41% (compared to 45% in 2022) of the attendees. This capturing of feedback is supported by Parent Forum meeting outcomes and discussions which acts as another opportunity for parents and carers to voices their viewpoints and concerns.

"As parents we think this is a wonderful school. We can see our child is flourishing and growing as a rounded person thanks to her school life. The teachers we've come across have been wonderful and the head is friendly and approachable. The leadership team of head and deputy are a really complimentary blend, both of whom we think are fantastic at what they do."

"Communication could be better with regards to what my child is doing and also upcoming events across the school year"

"My child loves the clubs, enjoys holiday club and feels part of the school team. She's very happy"

"Often clubs are fully subscribed"

"I feel reception need more supervision and guidance at lunch time. My child has repeatedly said his friends are hurting him when playing. I don't think it is intentional but it is still upsetting to think he is not enjoying playtime because of this"

"After just a short time at John Blow, our son is so much happier with his class, teacher and school and especially the behaviour of the other children towards him"

"I think the school is doing well helping all children get to a good level of learning. However I think more could be done to push the children who are meeting standards to get more into exceeding standards."

"Pleased with the extra support given to my kids"

"Very happy with the developments of the school over the past few years, lots more available for the children. Wrap around care for parents, holiday clubs as an option. The progression in developing the children as a whole is amazing. Having the flexibility to be able to come speak to someone if something has occurred is a bonus. Thanks for all the hard work"

"I feel that the easier children who are 'coasting' can sometime get left behind when it comes to recognition"

"Ware really pleased with the school, our child is really happy here."

#### So what? Next steps

- Training booked in for lunchtime supervision in November 2023 to support unstructured times in the day.
- Parent Forum survey to be reviewed to ensure maximum impact for all parties.
- Exploring ways to provide a platform for parents to raise their concerns: parents who have stated 'Strongly disagree' to statements within the survey have remained anonymous which makes it difficult to address concerns.
- A comprehensive summary of the survey will be shared with staff and governors and will be used to identify opportunities for development in the future.
- We will strive to 'Be the best we can be' in all aspects of school life moving forward.
