

Start of the school day arrangements Spring Term

To ensure the safety of all children at the start of the day, starting on the 4th of January, children will need to be dropped off at the gate near the KS1 playground. Meal price increase

As outlined in the letter sent to KS2 parents on Friday 8th December, the increase in prices for school lunches will come into effect on January 4th 2024. The school has covered the cost of this increase for December 2023 (they came into effect on 4th December) due to the short notice provided by Nottinghamshire County Council on the increases. As of 4th December 2023, meal prices for paid meals have increased to £2.95—this will be payable on the School Money app when ordering meals for the Spring Term.
